Olive Oil

If there is one substance that we Italians use everyday in our cooking and other preparations, it is olive oil. It is used in old home medicinal purposes, throwbacks from our grandparents' days, as well as is found in salads and sauces and cooked vegetables and just about anything prepared on the stove or preserved in jars.


There are hundreds of olive oils on the market today in the United States. They come primarily from Greece, Italy and Spain. The first thing to consider in choosing an olive oil is to make sure it comes from a single country source. Avoid mixed or varied oils. In addition, it is best when packaged in metal containers. Black glass is acceptable followed by dark brown glass and, finally, dark green glass. If your olive oil is packaged in plastic containers, it is best to transfer it to one of the above-mentioned containers. The container for the olive oil should display a harvest date. Harvests usually take place at the end of the calendar year. A fresh oil in 2023 was likely harvested in 2022. Properly stored at room temperature in a cupboard or closet, the oil should be good for 2-3 years. The best olive oils are identified as "Extra Virgin-First Cold Pressed." The taste and character of these olive oils depend upon the olive variety and country of origin. Experts rating these olive oils refer to them as being "peppery, fruity, mild, etc. Some are best for frying and cooking, while others are better for salads and dipping. The peppery olive oils can be bitter in taste. Of course, the choice and purpose of the use of olive oil are personal. In compiling my list of olive oil choices, I tasted and reviewed some thirty-odd ratings. My suggested choices for "Extra Virgin-First Cold Pressed" olive oils are as follows:


On the Bookshelf

Novelist, poet and feminist chronicler of Italian Americans, Helen Barolini recently passed. One of her novels, *Umbertina* traces four generations of women in a transition from immigrants to American citizens. She compiled short fiction, memoirs, and poems in *The Dream Book: An Anthology of Writings by Italian American Women*. She believed that Italian American women were underrepresented not only as subjects in American literature, but also as authors. Other writings: *Chiaroscuro: Essays on Identity," "Their Other Side: Six American Women and the Lure of Italy"*.




Monday, January 22, 2024 Detective Montalbano: The Shape of Water 2000 112 Minutes

Luca Zingaretti stars in this made-for-TV Italian-language drama which brings to life the true story of Giorgio Perlasca, an Italian who risked his life to save Jews in Second World War Hungary. Though Perlasca (Zingaretti) was initially a supporter of Italian fascism and fought for Mussolini in East Africa during the Italo-Abyssinian War, he became increasingly disenchanted with the doctrine as it merged with Hitler's anti-Semitic vision. In 1944, while based in Budapest for the purposes of business, Perlasca was confronted directly with the horror of the Holocaust and, unlike so many others, didn't turn a blind eye but did whatever he could to save lives.


